SJSU's Summer 2023 Early Start Program

SJSU's Summer 2023 Early Start Program gives admitted students pursuing STEM, Economics, and Business majors the opportunity to take General Education Math in the summer.

This summer, Early Start is offering a **completely online synchronous** version of MATH 18A: College Algebra for students in Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics (STEM), Aviation, Business, Economics, and Packaging majors.

Classes will be held from Monday, June 26, to Friday, August 11.

Students who are **eligible** for Pell and CA Dream Act tuition assistance will receive a full tuition waiver for the class. All other enrolled students will be charged \$764, a discounted rate from the regular summer rate of \$1,120 for four units.

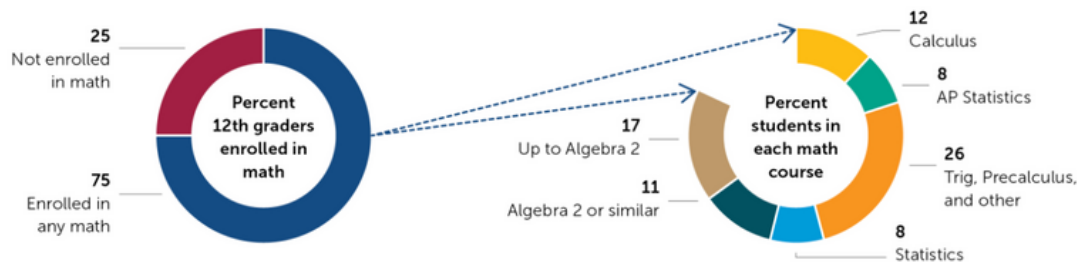

Note. Of the 75 percent of students enrolled in 12th-grade math, some take more than one math course.

UC Davis authors published an infographic in PACE about 12th-Grade Math, *An Updated Look at High School Math Course-Taking in California*. The infographic highlights students who took advanced math in 12th-grade and 11th-grade demonstrated stronger performance on the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBAC) for math. Authors also bring visibility to the disparities in 12th-grade math course-taking for students from different ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds. Overall the article gives educators the opportunity to think about students' math academic achievement and supportive methods to build math consistency that aligns with students' college and career goals.

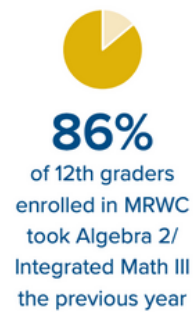
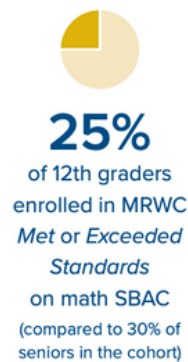
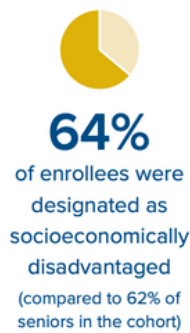
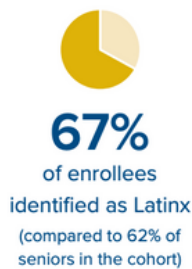

Mathematical Reasoning with Connections (MRWC)

MRWC Training for the 2023-24 Cohort

We are happy to announce that Mathematical Reasoning with Connections (MRWC) training for 2023-24. This training will consist of 2 days in June, 10 days in July, and the remaining 8 days in the fall.



- **Day 1 and 2:** June 12 & June 13
- **Days 3-12:** July 10-July14 & July 17-21
- **Days 13-20:** To be determined in Sept/Oct/Nov

Initial information regarding logistics and requirements for participation:

- This year's training is likely to be held online via Zoom or in a hybrid format with some days in person.
- All training days will be held from 8:00 am to 3:30 pm with appropriate breaks, unless otherwise noted.
- Participating teachers should have a full single-subject credential in Mathematics, be scheduled to teach at least one section of MRWC in the 2023-24 academic year, and provide us with administrator confirmation of this information.

- All materials (the teacher guide, student materials, and games) will be provided at no cost to qualified teachers.
- Before the beginning of the training, an MOU between the school and MRWC will be signed, establishing the conditions of this partnership.

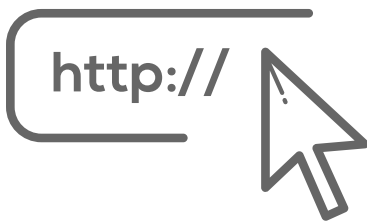
