Incident Summary:

- *It is alleged that on 4/26/2019, Beta Theta Pi Fraternity had loud music at their party and failed to comply with instructions from University Police to lower the music.*

Student Organization Code of Conduct Violations:

- (05) Excessive Noise
 - (C) Excessive noise which is disruptive to the campus or surrounding community.
- (08) Failure to Comply
 - (A) Failure to comply with the directions of University officials acting in the performance of their official duties.
- (08) Obstruction of University Officials
 - (B) Resisting or obstructing University officials acting in the performance of their official duties.
- (18) Risk Management of Events
- (24) Violations of Civil or Criminal Law
 - Student organizations in violation of local, state or federal law are in violation of the University Code of Conduct. University sanctions for such violations may be imposed independent of and prior to the disposition of any legal proceeding in a civil or criminal justice case.

Sanctions:

- **Organization Disciplinary Probation effective May 13, 2019 to November 13, 2019.**
Probation is entered on the Student Involvement website (i.e., "Recognized Student Organization (RSO) Conduct"), with beginning and end date.

- **Risk Management for Events Plan and Presentation by November 13, 2019.**

Executive Board shall create a more thorough plan for social events adhering to federal, national and university policies and procedures. Upon completion of creating the plan, the plan must be presented to and approved by the Associate Director in Student Involvement for approval at least 2 weeks prior to presenting the plan to IFC. The presentation shall be interactive and presented to your membership and IFC community at a mutually convenient time for your membership and the IFC Advisor. Until the completion and presentation of the plan, any event or activity that a reasonable person may label as an organization-affiliated or attended function must be substance free. SJSU defines a substance free environment as a setting that prohibits and lacks the presence of drugs and alcohol, including any legal medicinal and/or recreational drugs recognized by California state law.

- **Apology to University Police by September 1, 2019.** The organization shall create and execute a plan to apologize to University Police. Upon completion of creating the plan, the plan must be presented to and approved by the Associate Director in Student Involvement for approval at least 2 weeks prior to executing the apology.
