Delta Upsilon Fraternity

Case Creation Date:

- September 1, 2022

Incident Summary:

- *It has been reported to us that Delta Upsilon Fraternity has been engaging in unauthorized rush activities, including but not limited to: hosting unregistered/unauthorized events and parties, providing drugs and alcohol to those attending the events, and failing to comply recruitment regulations.*

Student Organization Code of Conduct Violations:

- (2) Alcohol
 - A copy of the University's Alcohol Policy shall be provided to each student organization president and must be followed. The University's Alcohol Policy is in compliance with California Law, which prohibits the sale or giving of any alcoholic beverage to any person under the age of 21. Student organizations are in violation of University policy if any individuals under the age of 21 are in possession of alcoholic beverages at an activity sponsored/hosted by the student organization and/or if intoxicated individuals consume alcohol. All student organization presidents must sign an agreement to abide by and uphold the University's Alcohol Policy as well as present an alcohol awareness program to their organizations (which should be pre-approved by the Prevention Education Program Center) or arrange for an alcohol awareness program approved by the Prevention Education Program Center. Student organizations sponsoring events are responsible for following the appropriate procedures to prevent underage drinking, including providing alternatives to alcohol.
- (6) Drugs
 - (A) Use, possession, manufacture, or distribution of illegal drugs, or drugrelated paraphernalia (except as expressly permitted by law and University regulations) or the misuse of legal pharmaceutical drugs, (B) Sponsoring/hosting an activity at which substances noted above are used.
- (8) Failure to Comply
 - (C) Failure to follow all policies and procedures established by the University pertaining to student organizations, including fraternities and

sororities, as outlined in the Student Organizations Handbook,

- (17) Pledging and New Member Intake
 - Student organizations that are not in compliance with pledging/new-member education requirements as outlined in their local and national constitutions and/or by-laws.

Sanctions:

As a result of the Conference, San José State University resolved the student organization is for these particular violation(s) of the Student Organization Code of Conduct; therefore, no disciplinary action will be taken by Student Conduct and Ethical Development on these charges. The cease and desist order placed on Sept 1st, 2022 has also been lifted.
