Incident Summary:

• It was reported that on or around 12:10 AM on 3/3/23, by a neighbor, that Kappa Sigma and Delta Zeta had a "wild outdoor party". University police responded. It was reported that this violated local noise ordinances. The event was an approved social event.

Student Organization Code of Conduct Violations:

- (5) Disorderly Conduct: (C) Excessive noise which is disruptive to the campus or surrounding community.
 - (C) Failure to follow all policies and procedures established by the University pertaining to student organizations, including fraternities and sororities, as outlined in the Student Organizations Handbook.
- (18) Risk Management of Events
- (24) Violations of Civil or Criminal Law Student organizations in violation of local, state or federal law are in violation of the University Code of Conduct. University sanctions for such violations may be imposed independent of and prior to the disposition of any legal proceeding in a civil or criminal justice case.

Sanctions:

• Formal Warning effective March 8, 2023.

No disciplinary action will be taken by Student Conduct and Ethical Development on these charges. As a result of Conference, the student organization was informed of San José State University's policies and procedures; henceforth the student organization is placed on notice and is expected to maintain the community standards of the University.
