Sanctions:

As a result of Conference, the student organization was informed of San José State University's policies and procedures; henceforth the student organization is placed on notice and is expected to maintain the community standards of the University.

• Attend the "Panhellenic Conversation around Hazing, Harassment & Human Dignity" workshop on February 17, 2020.
