Course Goals and Student Learning Objectives

Following activities and assigned reading, students will be able to demonstrate through class activities/assignments, skills tests, and written exams,

- Knowledge of fundamental skills and techniques in performing basic scuba skills.
- Proficiency in execution of the basic scuba skills covered.
- An understanding of the history, rules, strategies, current research, safety and etiquette associated with skin diving and scuba diving.
- An understanding of the mental and physical health benefits to be derived from skin diving and scuba diving here.
- An appropriate level of proficiency in personal fitness as it relates to components such as cardiovascular endurance, muscular strength and endurance, flexibility, body composition, balance, coordination, and agility.
- Demonstrate knowledge of:
 - o All online readings assigned and lecture material presented
 - o Proper procedure for use and care of scuba equipment
 - o Proper scuba etiquette and procedures for all populations and ages

Activity Program Learning Outcomes

After completion of the physical activity graduation requirement, students shall be able to:

- Demonstrate proficiency in the execution of the motor/sport skills appropriate to the specific activities completed.
- Identify and/or explain the applicable history, rules, strategies, current research, safety, and etiquette related to the specific activities completed.
- Identify and/or explain the benefits of physical activity as related to physical and mental health.

Text/Readings

The instructor will explain options for purchasing online materials and gear requirements during the orientation provided in the first session.

Course Notes

• Class protocol: Each session is a combination of lecture and in-pool instruction. **Lectures** will begin **promptly at 6:00PM** and the timing will vary depending on content. **Water skill instruction** will take place immediately after the lecture session, and students are responsible for providing any required gear as outlined by the instructor and for active participation. Students are responsible for being prepared according to the assignments on the syllabus. The timing will be flexible and depends on the material being covered. If students miss a class, both a lecture and a pool session are missed, or two instruction

- sessions see make up policy below. If a student is present for the instruction, and requires additional assistance with a particular skill, it is the student's responsibility to request assistance. However, if the deficiency is the result of missed class time, see make up policy below. No cell phone use is allowed during class.
- Recording class: Instruction may not be recorded. If classmates ask you to record their performance for later review make sure it is done before or after class rather than during class. Do not post or otherwise share the recording.
- Intellectual property: Course materials developed by the instructor (e.g., exam/quiz items, videos, lecture notes), are the instructor's intellectual property and cannot be shared or uploaded in any form publicly without the instructor's approval.

- **FINAL EXAMINATION:** Both a written final examination and a pool skills examination will be administered as indicated on the class schedule. Weighting for grading purposes is detailed below.
- MAKE UP POLICY: There will be <u>no make ups</u> for missed quizzes, tests, or pool skills evaluations, except for documented, serious and compelling reasons. It is the student's responsibility to contact the instructor should such a situation arise. Students are also responsible for all the material covered during any missed lectures and any pool skills taught during missed pool sessions. Once we begin scuba skills in the pool, students must demonstrate proficiency in the skills missed before being allowed to progress to the next skills. Missed classes will result in falling behind <u>don't miss class!</u>
