# BA 2 Year Planner for Transfer Students Psychology Department San José State University

This document outlines courses a transfer student can take to complete the Psychology BA degree requirements. This planner is a useful guide, but they should be used in consultation with Department Psychology Advisors to address each student's individual circumstances. Some useful links on the department website are <u>BA in Psychology</u>, <u>Advising Hours</u>, and <u>Building Your Course Schedule for Upper Division & Transfer Students</u>.

#### 2 Year Planner Overview

This planner contains a general **BA 2 Year Roadmap** for transfer students (p. 2) and **two sample 2 Year Schedules** (p. 3-4)

The Roadmap and sample schedules assume that you...

- are transferring with 60 semester hours.
- have completed your Core Lower Division GE and American Institutions requirements.
- have completed two separate Physical Education experiences at your community college.

#### Psychology 100W and the Upper Division Writing Self-Directed Placement

Psychology 100W is a required course in the BA degree and we recommend taking it in your first (preferred) or second semester at SJSU. First, complete the <u>Upper Division Writing Directed Self-Placement</u> and decide if you are ready for 100W, or want to first take 100A to further prepare for advanced academic writing. You can graduate in two years with whichever path you choose.

- If you choose to take PSYC 100W and meet the other prerequisites, see Sample Schedule #1
- If you choose to first take 100A, see Sample Schedule #2.

Additional considerations when building your 2 year schedule are...

- a maximum of 70 community college (lower division) units can contribute to the required 120 units for graduation.
- Up three units of a Psychology course (PSY or PSYC prefix) at your community college may count toward the Psychology Electives requirement, but **not** upper division core requirements (see courses listed in green box on pg. 2)
- if you attended a college on the quarter system, meet with an advisor to discuss how to convert the your psychology quarter units into semester units (i.e., multiply quarter units by .67).

#### **Semester 1 Class Registration Tips**

- Take 100W if you are ready for it based on <u>Upper Division Writing Directed Self-Placement</u> as it is a prerequisite for PSYC 118 and 190/195.
- Do **NOT** register for PSYC 118 or 190/195 in your first semester
  - Take PSYC 118 after 100W is completed; Take PSYC 190/195 after 118 is completed
- If you are missing BIOL 21/65 (with lab), PSYC 18, and/or PSYC 30, take these as soon as possible.
  - Note you can take these at a community college as well.
- Take 3-4 Psychology upper division required courses (see courses listed in green boxes on pg. 2)
- If you have trouble enrolling in enough psychology courses, you can still make progress toward your degree by:
  - o Taking university electives to fill out your schedule but see an advisor for guidance.
  - You can take courses to fulfill <u>Upper Division General Education</u> requirements.
- Become comfortable using <u>MyProgress</u>, <u>MyPlanner</u>, and <u>MyScheduler</u>.
- See an advisor for guidance on your specific scheduling requirements and needs.


