The following people come to you to ask which of their convictions *must* be dismissed and which *can* be dismissed.

Assume that

- Unless shown, the people are eligible to file for expungement (dismissal)
- They have no probation violations other than from new convictions shown on their records
- The last conviction shown is their last conviction

Abbreviations used:

Infrac = Infraction; Mand = Mandatory dismissal
Misd = misdemeanor, Disc = discretionary dismissal
Fel = Felony Inelig = ineligible for dismissal
