

### **SJSU Cares**

SJSU Cares provides comprehensive support for students facing financial crises, including emergency assistance, housing and food resources, and access to mental health services. ### **Financial Aid and Scholarships**



The California Dream Act Application (CADAA) allows qualifying SJSU students to apply for state and university financial aid. This application is unrelated to the federal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program.

Who should apply? Undergraduate and graduate students who meet the requirements for the CA Non-Resident Tuition Exemption (AB 540). This includes students who are undocumented with no social security number, and those with DACA, TPS, T Visa, or U Visa. Students will also need to be enrolled at least half-time (6 units or more) to qualify.

### Missed the priority deadline for 2024-25?

You should still apply! You may be eligible for university aid as long as funding is still available. Contact the Financial Aid and Scholarship Office for more information.

About the CADAA

### California Nonresident Tuition Exemption (AB 540 Exemption)

Nonresident students, including US citizens, permanent residents, and undocumented individuals (T visa U visa, DACA, asylum seeker, Special Immigrant Juvenile visa holder, VAWA, or TPS) may be exempted from paying out-of-state tuition fees. Students seeking the AB 540 exemption must satisfy attendance and graduation/transfer requirements from a California school (ex., K-12, adult school, and community college) in order to qualify.

Undocumented students who are eligible for AB 540 can apply for state aid with the CA Dream Act Application (CADAA).

### **Immigration Legal Services and Updates**



Direct immigration legal services are available free of charge to ALL SJSU students, recent Alumni, employees, and their immediate families.At SJSU, individuals can schedule an appointment with an immigration attorney from Immigrant Legal Defense (ILD), a nonprofit agency dedicated to providing immigration legal services.

ILD can provide consultations and case representation in most immigration cases. Services include (but are not limited to):

- Immigration Relief Eligibility Screenings
- · Detained and non-detained deportation (court) defense
- Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival (DACA)
- Advance Parole
- Temporary Protective Status (TPS)
- Deferred Enforced Departure (DED)
- Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS)
- Family petitions
- U & T visas
- VAWA petitions
- Refugee/Asylum
- Applications for Lawful Permanent Resident Status
- Citizenship
